Year End Summary: 2022-2023 continued to be a productive year for Community Futures Central Island. Our own loans portfolio had strong loan demand. We provided \$939,885 in loan dollar to seventeen businesses in the region. We also continued to be the delivery agent for the Rural Relief and Recovery Fund loans to small business.

An awarded contract with Island Coastal Economic Trust for our Business Recovery and Resilience Coaches was extended and we continued to support small businesses within our region with just in time coaching. In the fiscal year we supported 45 businesses with 891 hours of one on one business coaching. The results speak; the vast majority of clients have reached their pre pandemic sales and beyond and created jobs; 38 businesses maintained 78 jobs and created 35 jobs. We thought that was pretty impressive. The taxes generated by these employees, not to mention the income tax by the businesses, could easily cover the expense of this program. Return on investment was demonstrated. 43% of business served were lead by women, 17% lead by people with diversabilities and 7% were youth.

We also collaborated with Vancouver Island University to assisted in the delivery of the CET Program and provide access to training and support for entrepreneurs with disabilities.

We supported organizations by providing affordable strategic planning facilitation and work plan development. Notably we supported community planning and implementation to the Gabriola Chamber of Commerce with an economic development strategy for the island and an

operations plan which garnered them \$65K from the Regional District of Nanaimo and we assisted them with their REDIP application which they were awarded \$100k for the Island MBA Program which we partner.
